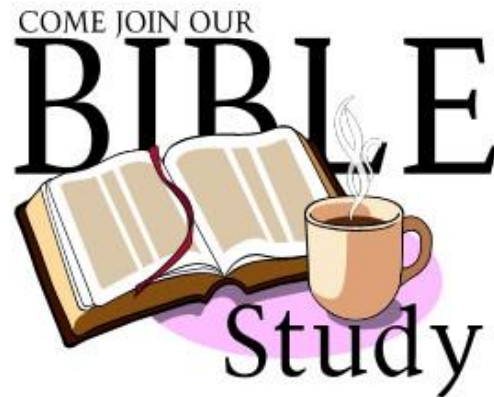


or how we enjoy it. The best part of all, is how important we are to the Lord. Don't ever forget, that he is interested in everything you do and say. He cares for you.

Youth Event

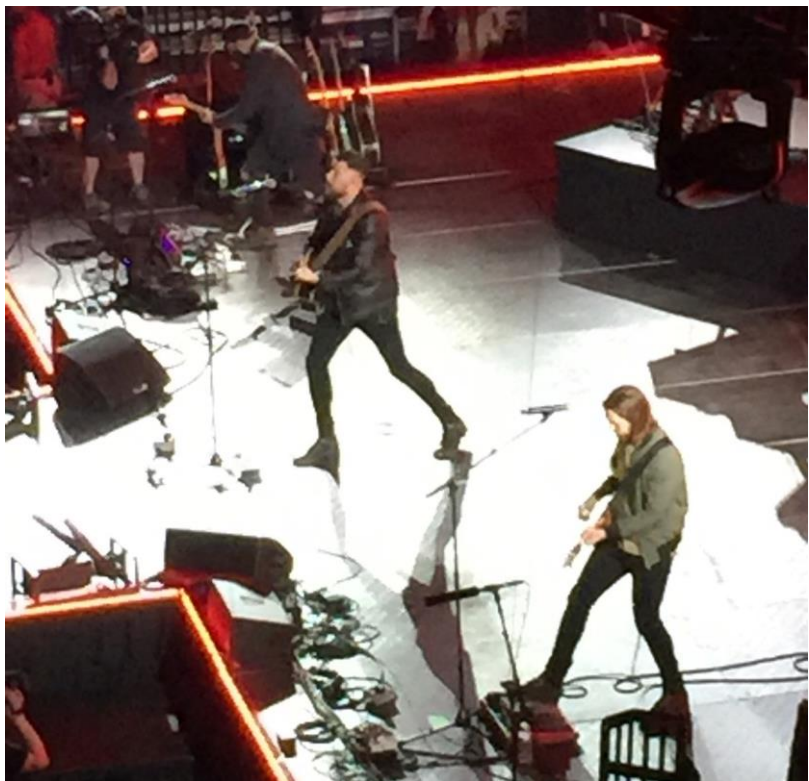
